Laura is passionate about finding innovative solutions to adapting and conserving our built heritage, against the backdrop of the climate emergency. Laura authored the Heritage Building Retrofit Toolkit in partnership with the City of London Corporation, developing a comprehensive process for climate action in heritage settings. She is on the Steering Group of Architects Declare, a network of 1300+ architectural practices committed to addressing the climate and biodiversity emergency. She has contributed to multiple industry initiatives including the Skills for a Sustainable Skyline Taskforce, Architects Climate Action Network, LETI, and the New London Architecture Conservation and Retrofit Expert Panel.
